PROPOSITION

THE STATES are asked to decide whether they are of the opinion -

in accordance with the provisions of the Data Protection (Jersey) Law, 1987, to appoint Mr. George Raymond Sidaway as Data Protection Registrar for a period of three years, on a full-time basis until 31st December, 1987 and thereafter on a part-time basis, at a salary equivalent to that of the maximum of Grade 15 of the Civil Service.

ESTABLISHMENT COMMITTEE

Report.

Article 2 of the Data Protection (Jersey) Law, 1987 creates the office of Data Protection Registrar, and the second Schedule to the Law declares that the Registrar shall be appointed by the States on such terms and conditions of service as the Establishment Committee may recommend.

The Establishment Committee, in accordance with these provisions, recommends to the States the appointment of Mr. George Raymond Sidaway as Data Protection Registrar for a period of three years, at a salary equivalent to that of the maximum of Grade 15 of the Civil Service, reduced as necessary to take account of the fact that the duties of Data Protection Registrar are not expected to be full-time after an initial period. The Establishment Committee proposes that Mr. Sidaway should serve on a full-time basis from the date of taking up his duties until 31st December, 1987, during which period he will be paid at the rate of £25,140 per annum, and that from 1st January, 1988, he should serve on a part-time basis, to be agreed with the Finance and Economics Committee, at a proportionate salary.
