Explanatory Note

These Regulations amend Regulation 4 of the Sea-Fisheries (Fishing Nets) (Jersey) Regulations, 1974, which presently prohibit the use of nets for drawing fish ashore elsewhere than in St. Ouen's Bay.

The effect of the amendments is to allow the use of such nets in the northern part of the Royal Bay of Grouville, as well as in St. Ouen's Bay, provided that, in any case, the nets have a minimum mesh size of at least 90 millimetres and are used only during the period of one hour before, and three hours after, low water.

THE STATES, in pursuance of Articles 2 and 5 of the Sea Fisheries (Jersey) Law, 1962,¹ as amended,² have made the following Regulations -

1. In Regulation 4 of the Sea-Fisheries (Fishing Nets) (Jersey) Regulations, 1974,³ as amended -

(a) for paragraph (1) there shall be substituted the following paragraph -

“(1) Except as provided in paragraphs (2) and (3) of this Regulation, no person shall use or cause to be used for the purpose of fishing for sea fish any draw net or any net for drawing fish ashore.”; and

(b) after paragraph (2) the following paragraphs shall be inserted -

“(3) A person may use a net for drawing fish ashore having in all its parts a mesh of at least the minimum mesh size prescribed in paragraph (4) of this Regulation during the hour before and the three hours after low water, in St. Ouen’s Bay and in the area of the Royal Bay of Grouville between the rocks known as Le Tas du Nord and the seaward end of the pier at Gorey.

(4) In this Regulation, ‘minimum mesh size’ means a mesh which when stretched diagonally lengthwise will allow the easy passage through it (whether the net is wet or dry) of a flat gauge 2 millimetres thick and 90 millimetres wide.”

2. These Regulations may be cited as the Sea-Fisheries (Fishing Nets) (Amendment No. 2) (Jersey) Regulations, 1989, and shall come into force on
