You will recall that we have in the past shared a mutual concern and interest in the above named family mostly at that time (1979) in connection with [REDACTED].

Since that time there are [REDACTED] in the family, namely [REDACTED]

Domestic circumstances in this family seem to have worsened and the home seems consistently grubby. [REDACTED] although in full-time employment, drinks heavily and this has been the cause of a number of disturbances in the home. The Police have been involved on occasions.

I wonder whether there is any regular contact at the Clinic between yourselves and the family or whether there is any home visiting? We believe that due to the marital situation, and drink related problems, there may be a risk position in this home and pass this on for your information. We shall continue to pay domiciliary visits and report to you as appropriate.

[REDACTED] at present has a very nasty and inflamed rash between her legs. The family G.P. has prescribed Retnovate which one hopes is being applied regularly.
