We now have two [REDACTED] children placed at the school. [REDACTED] [REDACTED] who is a most difficult and disturbed youngster without viable family contacts and [REDACTED] referred to earlier in this report.

Following extended discussions, frequent visits and recent negotiations, the Guernsey Children's Board and Education Council have requested taking up four long stay places on a permanent basis. These places will be reserved for them and will be available for children who meet the admissions criteria for the school.

Any admission will be preceded by discussions and consideration of whether the child would be appropriately placed at Les Chenes and acceptance of the child would always initially be for a six-week period of assessment.

The move by Guernsey to take up four long-stay places does have significant implications for the admissions policy of the school. There are seventeen long-stay places available, of which thirteen (three for girls) will continue to be available for Jersey children. At present eleven such places are occupied. Bearing this in mind it would appear reasonable to defer considerations of changes in the age of admission, continuing with the existing policy.
