Matters Arising

Dr. Essex-Cater stated that he had been unable to attend the A.G.M. of the Association of Jersey Charities, but had sent his apologies.

[redacted] Report

There had been one admission and one discharge since the last meeting. There were ten children in residence, which was the average occupancy. There was a shared-care caseload of three with fifty seven children in the Playgroup. Everyone was looking forward to the holiday in England and, fortunately, [redacted] was still able to go, although he had recently [redacted] during an expedition to Rozel Woods. [redacted] reported that the shared-care caseload was decreasing, with only three children at the moment. Fees were to be negotiated for outreach work, which it was agreed was very difficult to evaluate because of the complex, time-consuming and demanding nature of the work. Discussions would be held with [redacted] and Mr. Skinner, who would put our case. A lot of work was done with foster families while the residents themselves still needed lots of help with their complex lives. The starlings had gone from the loft but were now in the garage.
