EXPLANATORY NOTE

Article 4 of the Public Employees (Retirement) (Jersey) Law, 1967, permits the Establishment Committee to recommend to the States that the employees of certain organisations should be admitted to the contributory pensions scheme, namely -

Parochial Authorities

Statutory Undertakings

Public Utilities

those organisations satisfying the Committee that the staff "are wholly employed in work of a nature which might properly be undertaken by contributory members".

An approach has been received from the Vegetarian Home for Children (Jersey, Channel Islands) for admission to the scheme. This organisation is a registered charity which owns and runs La Preference Home for Children, St. Martin. The application is on behalf of the two house parents, whose work clearly equates with that of States own staff at, for instance, Haut de la Garenne, and satisfies the requirements and spirit of the Law.

In accordance with the Law a certificate has been obtained from the Actuary which certifies that the Vegetarian Home for Children (Jersey, Channel Islands) should contribute the following amounts to the contributory retirement scheme with effect from 1st October, 1980—

10 per cent of its employees' salaries, less 61p a week for each male employee and 58p a week for each female employee as the employer's contribution in both cases and 6 per cent of salary less equal deductions representing the employees' contribution.

No other payment will be involved unless in a subsequent valuation the Actuary certifies that these amounts are inadequate to fund the full benefits provided by the scheme, in which case, any extra costs must be met by the Home.

As the Children's Home is utilised by the Children's Department of the Education Committee, the Establishment Committee recommends the States that the Vegetarian Home for Children (Jersey, Channel Islands) be admitted to membership of the pension scheme.

PROPOSITION.

THE STATES are asked to decide whether they are of opinion—

to admit the Vegetarian Home for Children (Jersey, Channel Islands), on payment of 10 per cent of its employees' salaries, less 61p a week for each male employee and 58p a week for each female employee as the employer's contribution in both cases and 6 per cent of salary less equal deductions representing the employees' contribution, or such other amounts as the Actuary shall from time to time specify, to the Contributory Retirement Scheme with effect from 1st October, 1980, in accordance with the provisions of Article 4(2) of the Public Employees (Retirement) (Jersey) Law, 1967, which makes provision for the payment of pensions and other benefits under the Public Employees (Contributory Retirement Scheme) (Jersey) Regulations, 1967, as amended.

NOTE: The Finance and Economics Committee supports this Proposition.
