Explanatory Note.

The purpose of these Regulations is—

- (a) to enable an ordinary householder (being a land-owner) to counter-sign applications for cremation; and
- (b) to authorise the destruction of cremation certificates after they have been retained at the crematorium for at least ten years following a cremation.

THE STATES, in pursuance of Article 3 of the Cremation (Jersey) Law, 1953,⁽¹⁾ have made the following Regulations—

1. After sub-paragraph (g) of paragraph (3) of Regulation 5 of the Cremation (Jersey) Regulations, 1961,⁽²⁾ as amended (hereinafter referred to as the "principal Regulations") there shall be inserted the following sub-paragraph— 5

“(h) a person liable to pay foncier rate under the Parish Rate (Administration) (Jersey) Law, 1946, as amended”.

2. After Regulation 13 of the principal Regulations there shall be inserted the following Regulation— 10

“KEEPING OF CERTIFICATES, ETC.

13A. The application form, medical certificates and other forms specified in the First, Second, Third, Fourth, Fifth and Sixth Schedules to these Regulations shall be kept at the crematorium for a period of not less than ten years, after which they may be destroyed in such manner as may be directed by the Medical Officer of Health.” 15

3. These Regulations may be cited as the Cremation (Amendment No. 7) (Jersey) Regulations, 1977 and shall come into force forthwith on promulgation. 20
