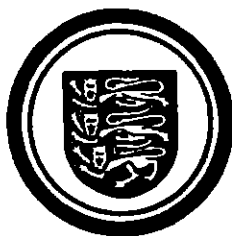

THE STATES, by virtue and in exercise of the powers conferred upon them by the Order in Council of the fourteenth day of April, 1884,<sup>(1)</sup> have made the following Regulations:—

1. In these Regulations—

“Community provisions” means any provision of the regulations of the European Communities referred to in the Schedule to these Regulations, as amended or replaced by any subsequent Community instrument. 5

2. The Community provisions shall have full force and effect in the Bailiwick and shall be regarded as enactments relative to Customs and Excise. 10

3. It shall be the duty of the Agent of the Impôts or any other officer of the Impôts to secure the enforcement and execution of the community provisions.

4. If any person contravenes or fails to comply with any Community provision he shall be guilty of an offence and liable to a fine not exceeding four hundred pounds. 15

5. Articles 54 and 56 of the Food and Drugs (Jersey) Law, 1966,<sup>(2)</sup> shall apply mutatis mutandis for the purpose of these Regulations as if reference therein to proceedings taken or brought under that Law included references to proceedings taken or brought for an offence under these Regulations. 20

6.—(1) These Regulations may be cited as the European Economic Community (Wine) (Jersey) Regulations, 1977.

5 (2) These Regulations shall come into force on the twelfth day of April, 1977, and shall remain in force until the twelfth day of April, 1980.
